## **E-Thymes April 2023**

"We are Easter People"

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." 1 Peter 1:3

"Easter people, raise your voices, sounds of heaven in earth should ring...

Fear of death can no more stop us from our pressing here below. For our Lord empowered us to triumph over every foe..."

Rev. William Marcus James wrote the words of this hymn, "Easter People, Raise Your Voices" (UMH 304) in 1979. It was first sung at Metropolitan Community UMC, in Harlem, where he had already been pastor for many years. Rev. James worked tirelessly both as pastor and civil rights activist, inspiring many young people to become involved in ministry themselves.

What does it mean to be Easter People? We might take a clue from the "living hope" that 1 Peter 1:3 mentions. Could it mean that the celebration of that one day, Easter, becomes the overriding purpose of one's life?

Jesus had proclaimed the kingdom of God in word and deed, feeding the hungry, healing the sick and even raising the dead. He broke down barriers to the marginalized, eating with the tax collectors and sinners. All his actions threatened the old guard. So, he was betrayed by his so-called friends and handed over to be killed as an enemy of the state. The few remaining disciples must have been paralyzed by fear, knowing that they could also be rounded up as co-conspirators. But by experiencing the miracle of his resurrection, Peter and the other disciples discovered a hope that lifted them above their fear.

The same power of God that raised Jesus can also be our aid in our own suffering and fears. As the hymn says, "Fear of death can no more stop us."

Indeed, the New Testament Acts of the Apostles recounts the courage and faith of those followers of Jesus after they had been born again into that living hope. Isn't courage inspiring? Jesus' followers now spoke boldly and convincingly to crowds and defended themselves before interrogators, who wanted to suppress the new movement. Because of that courage over fear, the movement grew.

What are your biggest fears? Are you afraid of poor health, of economic deprivation, of disappointing someone else, or of failure itself? Some people are understandably fearful that something terrible may happen to their children at school. As I've watched my own health deteriorate, an honest fear I have is that I won't have enough time to finish all the projects that I had put off until retirement. All these fears are related to the fear of death. But the experience of resurrection inspires hope. And that hope is the power of imagination to see beyond whatever obstacles life throws at us. So, let us be Easter People.

The Easter story begins with Good Friday. This year, we have the opportunity again to join with our friends at Shepherd of the Hills UMC, in Monterey Park, for a Good Friday service, April 7 at 7 p.m.

Easter falls on April 9. Besides being the celebration of Jesus' resurrection, Easter historically marked the ending of the Lenten fast, during which time Christians showed solidarity with Christ's suffering (incidentally, this year Lent and Easter overlap with Ramadan, when our Muslim friends are fasting). So, we begin the celebration of Easter morning with Easter Breakfast, beginning at 7 a.m., in the Fellowship Hall. Tickets will not be sold in advance.

Easter worship is at 10 a.m., with the flowering of the cross, baptisms and choir anthems, along with a special surprise guest. Children will have an Easter egg hunt. So if you have been shy about coming out for worship, don't be shy on Easter Sunday. See you then!
